## "Poor Choices"

1 Samuel 8

"and they said to him, "Behold, you have grown old, and your sons do not walk in your ways. Now appoint a king for us to judge us like all the nations." (8:5)

In Deut. 17:14-20, God anticipated a day when Israel would ask for a king 'like the other nations'. Even though god outlined what He wanted in a king, when this time came they didn't follow Deut. 17. All choices (no matter how small) set in motion a series of events and circumstances that sometimes lead us where we never thought we would go. They can seem good at the time but over time may prove to have been poor choices. Here in 1 Sam. 8 Israel's choice of a king goes against God's Word. What happens when we make poor choices?
