"Teach us to number our days that we may present to You a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12 [NASB])

We learned in Isaiah 38-39 that Hezekiah didn't finish as strong as he could have. If Jesus commands us to live 'one day at a time' (Matt. 6:34) what can we do each day to live faithfully with the Lord so that when our last day comes we will have "fought the good fight, finished the race and kept the faith"? There is a Psalm that Hezekiah would have known, written by Moses and probably sung in the temple during his time. Moses teaches us "to number our days". Since the past is behind us and the future unknown, then all we can really count is - today!
