"How to Celebrate Your Salvation" 2 Chronicles 35

"The Passover had not been observed like this in Israel since the days of the prophet Samuel; and none of the kings of Israel had ever celebrated such a Passover as did Josiah" (2 Chron. 35:18)

Once Josiah found the Law and understood what it said he sought to apply it to his life and the nations' life. The Chronicler gives 19 verses to this Passover that Josiah celebrated and mentioned that it was the greatest Passover celebration in Israel's history! Quite the statement. Let's look at this Passovers and see what made it so special.
