The psalmist's enthusiasm for God's Word continues in spite of ongoing oppression from those who seem to know it but have rejected it (119:49-72). Why would his enthusiasm continue? Because in turning to God's Word in his difficulties he has seen how relevant God's Word is to the everyday situations of life. Plus, God's Word is right because God is righteous. Therefore we can have confidence in God's Word to direct us to do what's right and to know what's true in life, whether we see it or not.
