"Denials" Mark 14:27-42

"Peter insisted emphatically, 'Even if | have to die with You, | will never disown You'" (14:31) "Going a little further Jesus fell to the ground and prayed that if possible the hour might pass from Him." (14:34)

The Passover is finished, Judas has gone for reinforce-ments, and Jesus awaits His arrest and subsequent crucifixion. With the little time He has left Jesus wants to warn the disciples one last time about what's coming up and prays to the Father about the cross. The disciples claim to be ready to stick with Jesus – even die with Him! – whereas Jesus honestly wrestles with His own readiness to stick with God's plan. Peter does deny Jesus while God 'denies' Jesus' request that 'this cup might pass from Me.' Strangely enough, we are better for these denials because God's 'no' always means a better 'yes'.

The resurrection teaches repentance & forgiveness is always available to the child of God. Pray for us/those who need restoration

- 14:38 *"Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation"* Pray that we take seriously the connection between our prayer life and our walk with God
- 14:36 *"everything is possible for You . . . Yet not I will but what You will. . ."* Pray we are willing to trust God's will no matter what
