“The King’s Psalm”

Psalm 110

“The LORD will extend your mighty scepter from Zion; you will rule in the midst of your enemies.”

(Ps. 110:2)

This Psalm contains the most quoted Old Testament verse quoted in the New Testament. Jesus quoted it Himself stating that it referred to Himself! Peter acknowledged that David was a prophet and spoke not of himself here but of Jesus, the Messiah who will return to rule from Zion. While we sing for joy about Jesus’ rule and return it will not be a joyful time for those who’ve rejected Jesus.
