Read **John 12:1-11**. What insight do we have here about Judas that the disciples were ignorant of at the time?

## "Judas: What Went Wrong?"

"Then Jesus replied, "Have I not chosen you, the Twelve? Yet one of you is a devil!"  $^{71}$  (He meant Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, who, though one of the Twelve, was later to betray him)." [John 6:70-71]

The Judas narrative is a difficult one for believers to wrestle with. Jesus chose him to be one of "the 12" and yet he betrayed Jesus. While we often discuss theological issues around Judas (was he saved? Did he lose his salvation? Did he even have a choice?, etc.) perhaps it would be more beneficial to examine him as someone who associates themselves with Jesus for awhile only to choose not to later on. From that perspective, there have been (and continue to be) many Judases who follow Jesus for a period of time only to abandon Him at some point.

## **Judas Was Initially Drawn to Jesus**
